

Biography

Dr. Milton D. Cox is founder and Director Emeritus of the Center for the Enhancement of Learning, Teaching, and University Assessment at Miami University. He initiated and directs the International Lilly Conference on College Teaching and is founder and Editor-in-Chief of the Journal on Excellence in College Teaching and the Learning Communities Journal. Milton has been director of grants establishing faculty learning community programs at other institutions, is co-editor of the book, Building Faculty Learning Communities, and has visited over 100 institutions in the U.S. and abroad to consult on various opportunities to improve teaching and learning in higher education. Since Summer 2013, Milton has been helping HKBU colleagues establish Communities of Practice (CoPs) in the University. While guiding them to maintain the momentum of their CoP projects, Milton also provides useful advice to HKBU colleagues as to the collection of evidence on student learning and the promotion of scholarship of teaching and learning.

Abstract

Implementation is the art and science of incorporating evidenced-based innovations, interventions, and programs into typical human service settings to benefit the clients of practitioners. Implementation science research confirms that CoPs are one of the few purveyors in higher education that effectively enables instructors and professionals to implement and sustain teaching and learning interventions for their students and programs. In this session we will investigate the strategies, processes, and assessment that implementation science recommends to sustain CoP programs and their teaching interventions.
